Dear Ms. Echhols:

For over ten years, my family and I have enjoyed the unique experience of Two Day Town and the beauty of Lake Del Valle on the last weekend of April. It has been a rewarding tradition and an entire community supports the "leave no trace" philosophy of the event. It is part of the vital social fabric of Livermore and surrounding areas.

Having read the memorandum of August 29th, I am at a loss to understand why this lengthy list of requirements has come into play at this time. I cannot believe all these perceived transgressions need to be curtailed in order for the park district to approve a permit to hold the event in 2023. While I realize that communication styles and some political implications might impede reaching an agreement which would enable this special weekend to continue, I urge careful negotiation and concessions on both sides.

Please know that it would be virtually impossible for an all-volunteer operation like Two Day Town to fulfill all the requirements outlined in the memo. I urge prioritization of what provisions must be adopted this year, and which could be postponed or modified to allow realistic adjustments that fit the park district's interests in future years.

Families, nature-lovers, musicians, kids and an entire generation look forward to this tradition. One weekend a year is all we ask, and both entities must compromise. If the board is a true steward of this special land we all love, getting to "yes" is essential.
